

If you have ever had an driver's license, be cautious about getting a new driver's license.

If you used someone else's social security number or made up a number to obtain a driver's license you could be charged with fraud, a felony. The Iowa DOT uses facial recognition software to recognize when the same person has obtained a driver's license using a different name or social security number. The Iowa DOT can report you to ICE for fraud.



Do Not Leave the U.S. while your application is still pending!

If you leave, you will no longer be eligible for DAPA or DACA.

You might become a deportation priority.

What to Send

- DACA or DAPA Application & Supporting Documents
- Application for Work Authorization
- Application for Work Authorization Worksheet
- 2 passport-size photos.
- \$465 Check or Money Order made payable to “U.S. Department of Homeland Security”

Do not send in any original documents with your application. Only send photocopies of originals.

Tips for your Application

- Keep a copy of everything you submit for your own records.
- You can choose regular mail or express mail (express mail includes Fed-Ex or UPS) when sending your application to USCIS.
- If you choose express mail, you will get a receipt from the post office (or Fed-Ex or UPS) confirming that USCIS has received your application.

You can call the National Customer Service Center at 1-800-375-5283 to request a status update on your application.

What Happens Next?

- USCIS will mail you a receipt confirming they received your application.
- USCIS will send you a notice to schedule a biometrics appointment within about 30 days. You will have to go to an Application Support Center (ASC) to attend your appointment. The nearest ASC is located in Des Moines, Iowa.
- The address for the Des Moines ASC is:

- You must complete the biometrics appointment to receive DACA or DAPA.
- During the biometrics appointment USCIS will get your fingerprints and take your picture.
- If anything is missing from your application or USCIS wants further documentation, they may send you an RFE. The RFE will tell you what information USCIS wants you to provide. The RFE will also tell you where to send the information and the deadline for responding
- USCIS will notify you by mail when your application is approved or denied.
- If your application is approved, USCIS will mail you an Employment Authorization Document.
- USCIS is currently processing DACA applications in around 6 months.
