



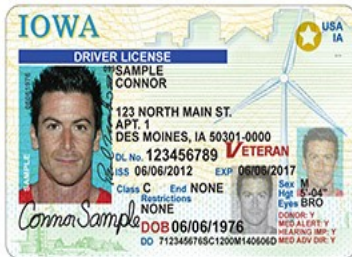
- No one can get you faster results!
- DAPA and DACA applications are free at www.USCIS.gov

→ Do Not Leave the U.S.! If you leave you:



- will likely not be eligible for DAPA or DACA
- Might become a deportation priority

→ If you have an Iowa driver's license, be cautious about getting a new driver's license, especially if you used someone else's number or made up a number. The Iowa DOT uses facial recognition software, and can report you to ICE for fraud.



Removal Priorities

Along with DAPA and DACA, President Obama has created new priorities of categories of people for ICE to focus on prosecuting. If you fall into one of these categories, you should contact an immigration attorney.

Priority 1

- People convicted of felonies
- People involved in gang activity
- National security threats
- People stopped at the border on or after January 1, 2015

Priority 2

- Those convicted of certain significant misdemeanors, or
- Multiple misdemeanors
- Persons who unlawfully entered the U.S. and cannot prove continuous presence since January 1, 2014
- Those who abuse the visa or visa waiver program

Priority 3

- People with an order of removal on or after January 1, 2014

DAPA Requirements

- You must be a parent to a U.S. citizen or a green card holder on or before November 20, 2014.
- You must show that you have lived in the U.S. since January 1, 2010.
- You must have been in the U.S. on November 20, 2014 when President Obama announced DAPA.
- You must have had no lawful immigration status on November 20, 2014.
- You cannot have committed certain crimes or immigration offenses. Minor traffic offenses will most likely not make you ineligible for DAPA.

DACA Requirements

- You must have entered the United States before age 16.
- You must show that you have lived in the U.S. since January 1, 2010.
- You must have been in the U.S. on November 20, 2014 when President Obama announced DAPA.
- You must have had no lawful immigration status on November 20, 2014.
- You must have graduated from high school, earned a GED, or currently be in high school OR have been honorably discharged from the U.S. military.
- You cannot have committed certain crimes or immigration offenses. Minor traffic offenses will most likely not make you ineligible for DACA.



Documents Needed

- Proof of your identity. Examples include:
 - Passport
 - Photo ID
 - Expired U.S. visa
- Proof you have lived in the U.S. since January 1, 2010. Examples include:
 - Bank statements
 - Mortgages or leases
 - Money orders
 - Vaccination records
 - School Records
 - Passport
- Court records of any criminal matters and immigration records
- For DAPA: Proof you are a parent to your child. Examples include:
 - Birth certificate
 - Adoption Record
- For DAPA: Proof your child is a U.S. Citizens or green card holder
 - Birth certificate
 - Certificate of citizenship
 - **Valid** green card
- For DACA: Proof of Entry before 16th birthday examples include:
 - School records
 - Immunization records
